The design features high curved back- rest which is fitted to a stool with crossed legs carved to represent the necks and heads of ducks.

The deeply curved seat is designed to hold a cushion

S

The armrests have carvings of protective dieties and religious symbols are also visible.

I

The paws rest on a small platform, emphasizing majesty and stability

The design symbolises the connection of king with the gods, particularly the sun god Ra

This was not a everyday chair so it demonstrate status, not just provide comfort



M

Wood Base - Primary structure of chair is crafted with wood like Sycamore fig or Aracia both native to egypt.

A

Covered with gold leaf - The entire surface is overlaid with gold leaf emphasizing the wealth and divine status of pharaoh.

T

Inlays- Inlays of coloured glass and semi precious stones like lapis lazuli , Carnelian (orange - red stone) and Turquoise (for colorful detailing)

E

Silver- Used in combination with gold in detailing, though gold dominated

R

Gesso- Mixture of gymsum or chalk with glue applied as a preparatory layer in the wood before painting or gliding

I

Faience - Glazed ceramic material made from ground quartz, giving vibrant turquoise and blue hues

A

Obsidian and Calcite - Used for eyes in decorative scenes or accents

L

Paint / Pigments - Natural mineral based paints for fine detailing (e.g. black from carbon , red from ochre)

Linen or Leather- Used for seat panel, which is stretched over frame.

Cord or Sinew- For Seat weaving

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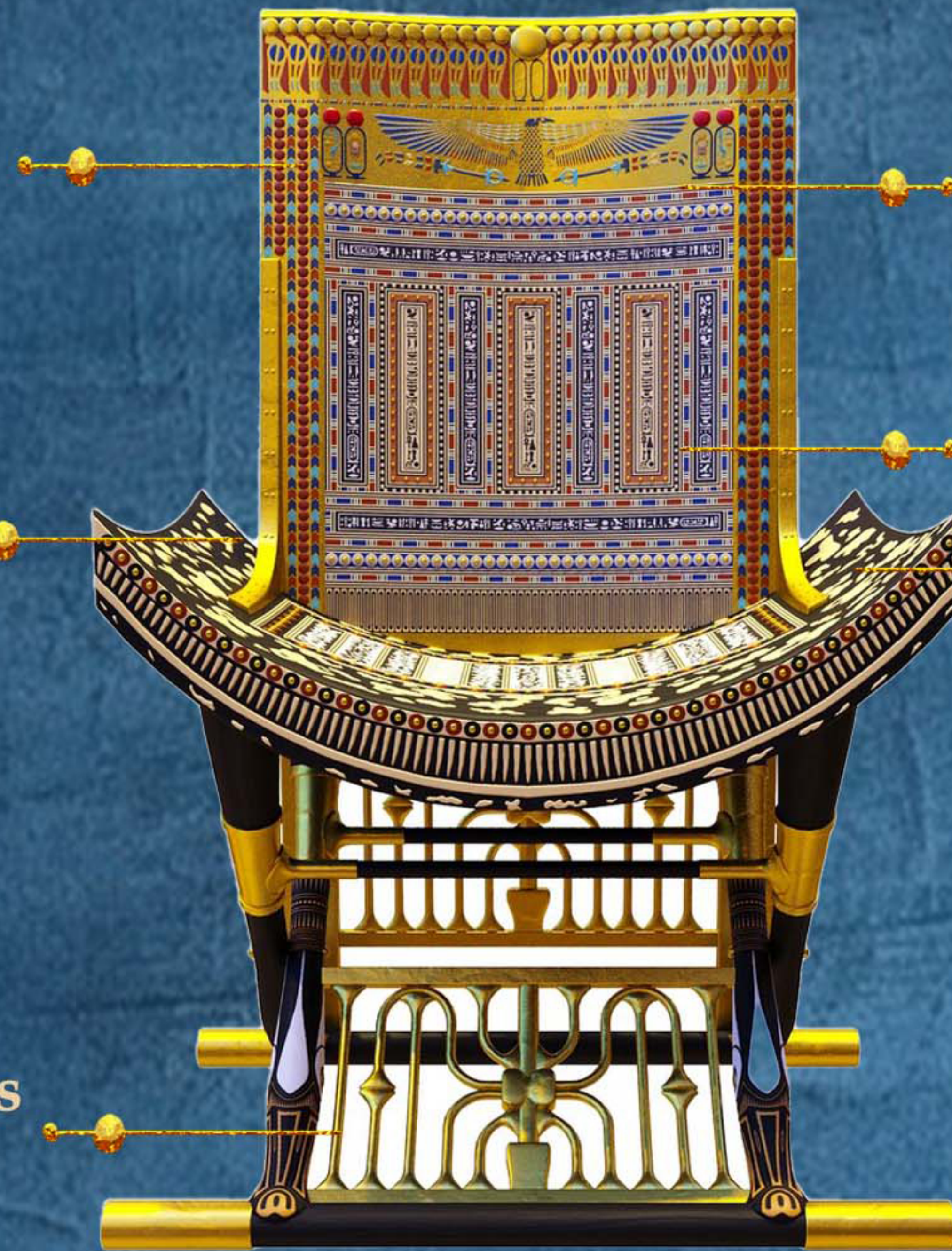

Gold foil and semi precious stones

Seat resembles an animal skin, possibly a leopard's

Decorated with Lotus motifs in gold



Vulture goddess Nekhbet with wings outstretched to protect king's cartouches

Symbolises Sema - Tawy Motifs

Decorated with papyrus motifs, symbolizing unification of upper and lower egypt

This chair symbolises wealth, divine status, richness, blessing, strength, power, majesty and stability
Designes to accompany king in the afterlife

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Mortise and Tenon Joints - Woodworking technique used for seat and frame.



Dowels and Pins - Wooden dowels or copper pins are used to reinforce the joints and secure different parts of chair together. These pins are covered in gold



Inlay work- Inlays of ebony , ivory and colored pigments are used to decoarte chair and create textures to stimulate animal skin.

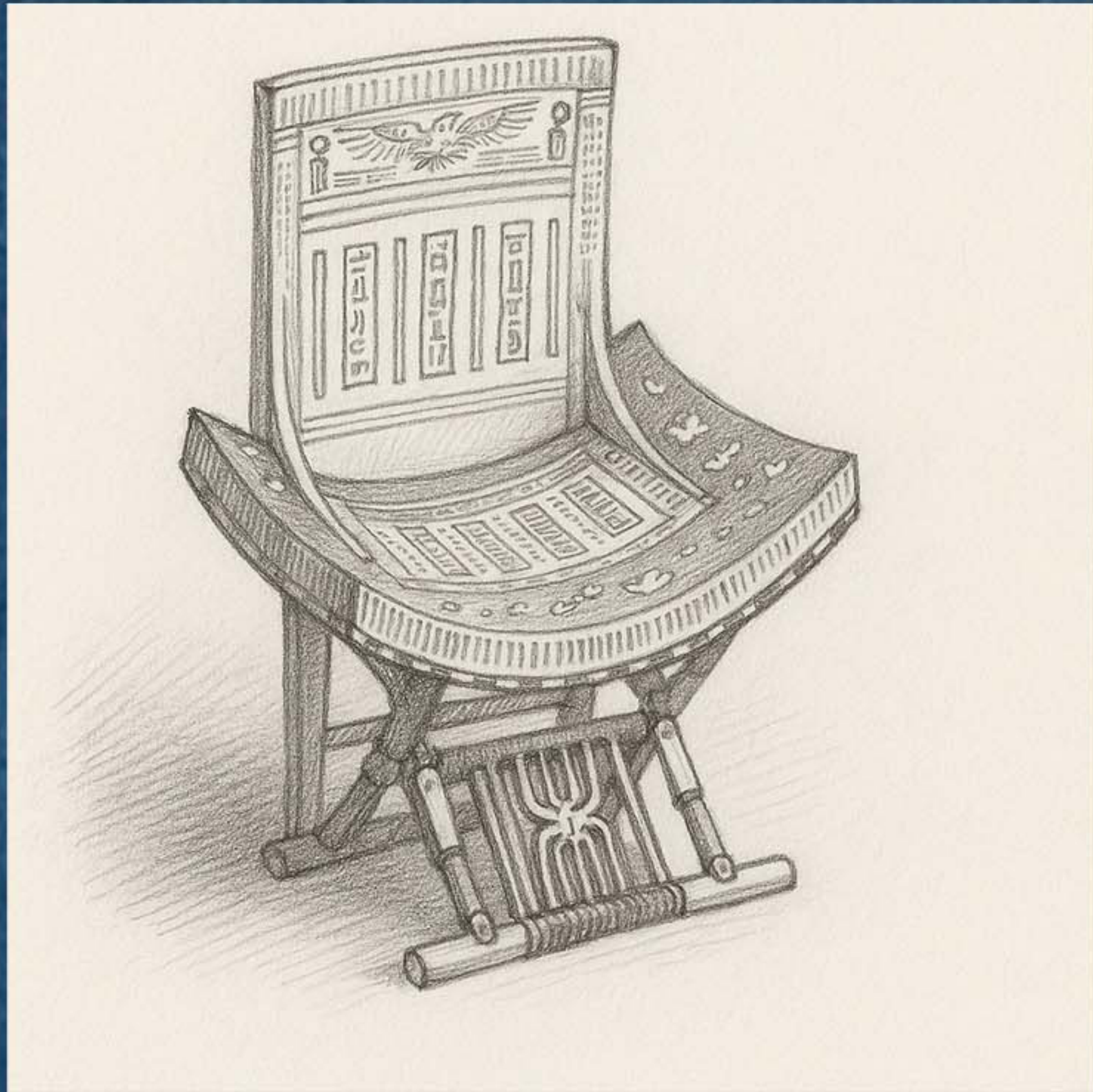
Cord or Sinew- Used for seat weaving

GLOSSARY

Pharaoh- Title used for rulers of ancient Egypt.

Iconography- Visual images, symbols or modes of representation used in works of art

Gliding- Process of applying a thin layer of gold to a surface.

Inlay- A decorative technique of embedding different materials into base object.

Ebony- A dense black hardwood

Ivory- Material made from elephant tusks

Faeince- Glazed Material from ground quartz, giving vibrant turquoise and blue hues.

Carnelian- Orange red stone often used in inlays.

18th Dynasty- A period of Egyptian history (circa 1550-1292 BCE), known for powerful pharaohs.

Ceremonial Furniture- Furniture created for ritual, state, or symbolic purposes rather than everyday use.



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
